As a member of the QHS Decanal Team, the Vice-Dean, Basic & Public Health Sciences will oversee and provide guidance and expert advice to the undergraduate health sciences programs (BHSc, LISC/BCHM) and the graduate programs within the School of Medicine. The ideal candidate will exhibit excellent relationship building skills and demonstrated leadership experience, with the ability to represent and advance the academic interests of QHS and the School of Medicine.

Working closely with the QHS Department Heads, the Vice-Dean, Basic & Public Health Sciences will oversee the recruitment, renewal, tenure, and promotion (RTP) processes for non-clinical faculty, as well as the performance and merit processes for QUFA faculty in the School of Medicine. The successful candidate will be a strategic thinker and problem solver, with knowledge of the operational and governance structures of the university. The preferred candidate will also have demonstrated experience in collective agreement and university policy interpretation as it relates to the non-clinical departments and programs in the School of Medicine.
