The Department of Gender Studies at Queen’s University invites applications from suitably qualified candidates interested in teaching a course in *Women, Gender, Difference (GNDS 120/3.0)*. This is an on-campus, introductory lecture blended course with an expected enrolment of ~400 students (with teaching assistants). Candidates should have a PhD, and teaching experience at the university level in intersectional approaches to women’s and/or gender studies. This is a fall term appointment for the period September 1, 2017 to December 31, 2017 with classes in session from September 11, 2017 to December 1, 2017.

The University invites applications from all qualified individuals. Queen’s is committed to employment equity and diversity in the workplace and welcomes applications from women, visible minorities, Aboriginal peoples, persons with disabilities, and LGBTQ persons. All qualified candidates are encouraged to apply; however, Canadians and permanent residents will be given priority.

The University will provide support in its recruitment processes to applicants with disabilities, including accommodation that takes into account an applicant’s accessibility needs. To comply with Federal laws, the University is obliged to gather statistical information about how many applicants for each job vacancy are Canadian citizens / permanent residents of Canada. Applicants need not identify their country of origin or citizenship, however, all applications must include one of the following statements: “I am a Canadian citizen / permanent resident of Canada”; OR, “I am not a Canadian citizen / permanent resident of Canada”. Applications that do not include this information will be deemed incomplete.

Applications should include a complete and current curriculum vitae, letters of reference from two (2) referees, and any other relevant materials the candidate wishes to submit for consideration such as a letter of intent, teaching dossier, etc.
