The Department of Gender Studies at Queen’s University invites applications from suitably qualified candidates interested in teaching a course in *Gender and Poverty (GNDS 421/6.0)*. This is an on-campus, fourth year seminar course with an expected enrolment of ~25 students. Candidates should have a PhD, and teaching experience at the university level in intersectional approaches to women’s and/or gender studies. This is a fall term appointment for the period September 1, 2017 to December 31, 2017, with classes in session from September 11, 2017 to December 1, 2017.

The University invites applications from all qualified individuals. Queen’s is committed to employment equity and diversity in the workplace and welcomes applications from women, visible minorities, Aboriginal peoples, persons with disabilities, and LGBTQ persons. All qualified candidates are encouraged to apply; however, Canadians and permanent residents will be given priority.

The University will provide support in its recruitment processes to applicants with disabilities, including accommodation that takes into account an applicant’s accessibility needs. The academic staff at Queen's University are governed by the *Collective Agreement* between the Queen's University Faculty Association (QUFA) and the University, which is posted at <http://www.queensu.ca/facultyrelations/faculty-librarians-and-archivists/queens-qufa-collective-agreement>.

To comply with Federal laws, the University is obliged to gather statistical information about how many applicants for each job vacancy are Canadian citizens / permanent residents of Canada. Applicants need not identify their country of origin or citizenship, however, all applications must include one of the following statements: “I am a Canadian citizen / permanent resident of Canada”; OR, “I am not a Canadian citizen / permanent resident of Canada”. Applications that do not include this information will be deemed incomplete.

Applications should include a complete and current curriculum vitae, letters of reference from two (2) referees, and any other relevant materials the candidate wishes to submit for consideration such as a letter of intent, teaching dossier, etc.

Course Description:
GNDS 421/6.0 Gender and Poverty 3S

This course is designed to provide an in-depth exploration of poverty issues in Canada. It includes discussions about working poor and welfare poor and addresses how race and sexuality can compound the issues of poverty. The course will also acknowledge how poor people are actively engaged in attempting to improve their lives through anti-poverty organizing.

This course contains an intensive and independent study component.

PREREQUISITE Level 3 or above in a GNDS Major or Medial or SXGD Plan, or permission of the Department.

EXCLUSION No more than 6.0 units from GNDS 421/6.0; POLS 318/3.0; POLS 382/3.0.
