Dear Student and Parent/Guardian,

Thank you for your interest in the On-Line to Success (OLTS)-Ontario program. The following is an information letter regarding the program, its intent, the course schedule, and curriculum. OLTS-Ontario is a transition program for Grade 12 students across Ontario with learning disabilities, ADHD, ASD, and/or mental health disorders. The program is run by the Regional Assessment and Resource Centre at Queen's University and is fully funded by the Ministry of Advanced Education and Skills Development. There is no cost to participants.

To be eligible for the OLTS-Ontario program, students must meet the below criteria:

- ► Be in Grade 12 (or doing additional year)
- ► Plan to attend college or university
- Able to attend one virtual Opening Day either on Thursday, June 27, 2024 or Thursday July 4, 2024
 And one (or both) of the following:
- ► Be identified/diagnosed with a learning disability, ADHD and/or ASD and/or:
- Be diagnosed or self-identify with a mental health disorder

COURSE CURRICULUM

The OLTS-Ontario curriculum is grounded in research conducted by the Learning Opportunities Task Force (commissioned by the Gov't of Ontario). This study showed that success for students with learning disabilities at post-secondary is maximized by participating in targeted transition training to address areas that research has shown are problematic for students with learning disabilities.

The course has evolved over the past twenty years to include students with ADHD, ASD and/or mental health disorders as they make the transition to post-secondary education. Course activities include topics such as: identifying your strengths and challenges, understanding your learning profile, time management, stress management, self-advocacy, and navigating the Accessibility Office.

The program is developed and delivered by trained and experienced educators, in consultation with psychologists from RARC.

Upon completion of all course work, students will have the opportunity to sign up for a psychologist consultation to review their current documentation and discuss next steps for connecting with Accessibility Services at their post-secondary school for accommodations and other available resources.

COURSE SCHEDULE

The following are the components of the OLTS-Ontario course:

Opening Day: Students attend one half-day day virtual course overview and orientation session.	June 27th, 2024 or July 4th, 2024
On-Line Modules: Students complete the online course work. The course consists of online modules to work through. It is expected to take about 48 hours to complete.	June 27th – August 2024
Psychologist Consultation: Upon completion of all modules, students will have the opportunity to meet virtually with a RARC psychologist to review current documentation and get advice on connecting with Accessibility Services and other resources at their post-secondary institution. There is no cost for this consultation.	Schedule upon completion of all modules (optional)

PSYCHOEDUCATIONAL ASSESSMENTS

The Regional Assessment and Resource Centre (RARC) can provide students with learning disabilities, ADHD, and/or ASD who complete OLTS-Ontario with an updated psychoeducational assessment. Up to date documentation (such as a recent psychoeducational assessment) is required for all students to access accommodations at college and university. Students must first be accepted to a post-secondary institution before the assessment can be completed. The offer of psychoeducational assessments is not time sensitive. The current fee structure for a psychoeducational assessment is currently set at \$2800-\$3200, and there are funding sources available, which can greatly reduce or eliminate the cost entirely.
