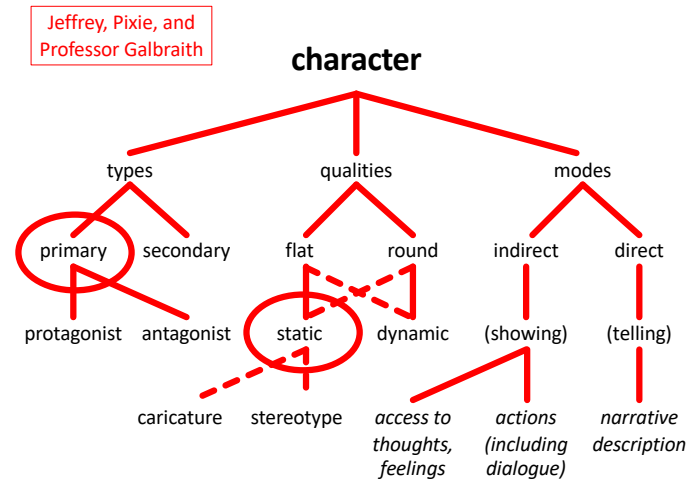
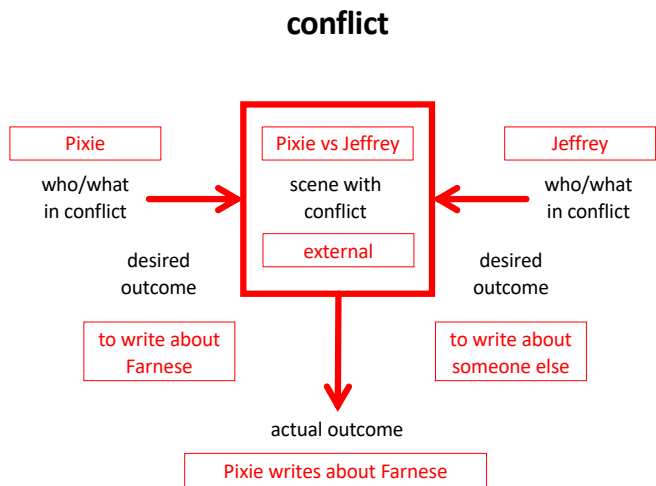
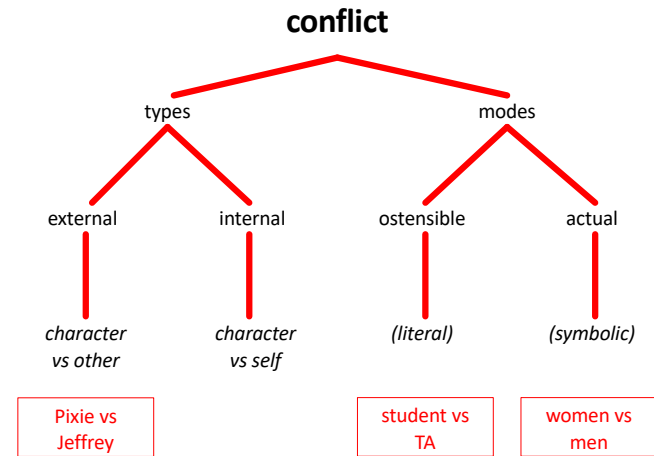
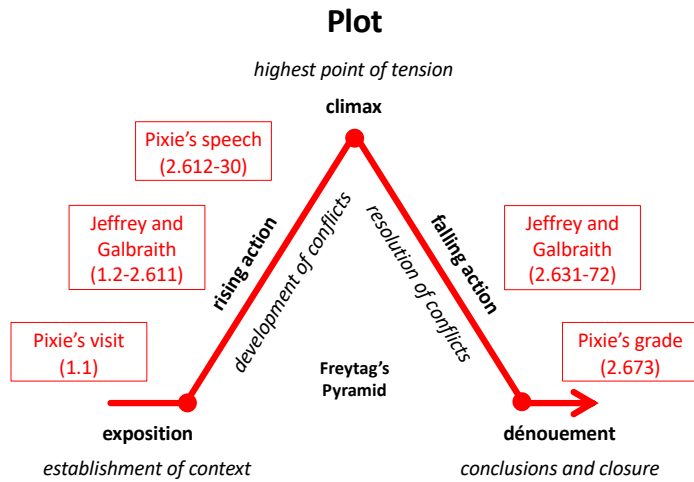


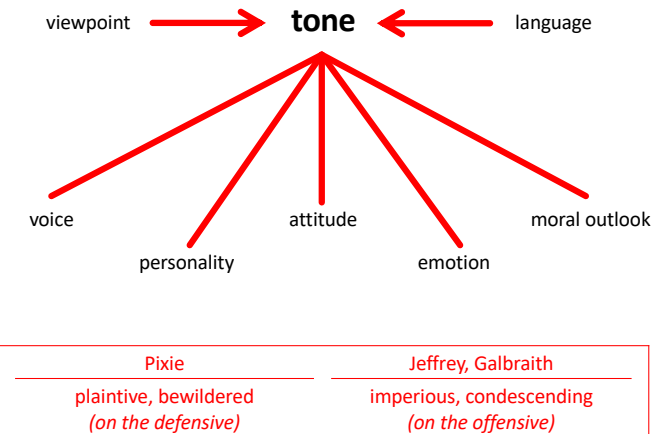
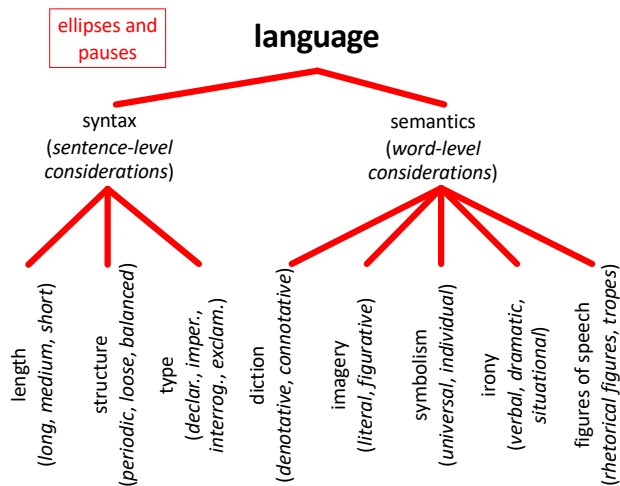
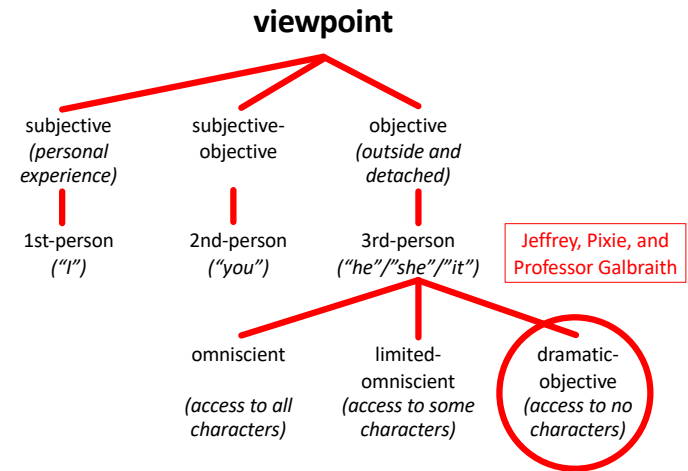
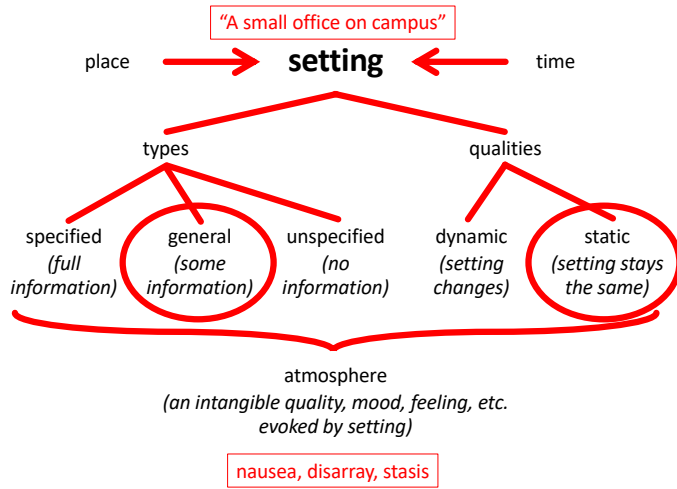
- born in Ottawa to a family of progressive academics
- studied acting at the National Theatre School in Montreal, and then literature at U of T
- gained widespread acclaim at Toronto’s SummerWorks festival with her debut plays, including *Essay* (2005), which won an award for best new play
- her work is characterized by a blend of satire and dark humour, and often deals with challenging or controversial topics (436)

The Elements of Drama



- plot** *organized narrative*
- conflict** *tensions/oppositions*
- character** *people/entities*
- setting** *when and/or where*
- viewpoint** *who the narrator is*
- language** *rhetorical devices*
- tone** *attitude of narrator*
- mode**^{NEW!} *dramatic subgenre*
- theme** *abstract concept*

📖 Shakespeare, <i>Twelfth Night</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • problem play • tragicomedy
📖 Wilde, <i>The Importance of Being Earnest</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • comedy of manners • farce
📖 St Bernard, <i>Salome's Clothes</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • political allegory
📖 Moscovitch, <i>Essay</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Juvenalian satire

- a categorization of a play by its subgenre
- often revealed in aspects of the play's performance about which audiences have conventional expectations (words, music, costumes, lighting, mise en scène, etc.)
- playwrights sometimes invert these expectations to explore different modes and the grey areas between them (D 8-10)
