5.	JDUC Naming Opportunities • Proposal attached for review	C.A Budd/ J. Hill	Concerns raised at the previous meeting have been shared with the planning committee. They have advised that the use of Western Art was just a place holder, not their intention to utilize in the final buildings. Once theirs a competition and selection for the architect, we will be able to advise them of our concerns with regards to the 7 grandfather teachings to the risers instead of the tread. Additionally, to prioritize Haudenosaunee & Anishinaabe art. Jim Leech name in the original circle (proposed location for the meeting place). Proposition to remove the Gaelic term or add additional Indigenous language to the room. Concern around whether keeping his name detracts from the purpose of indigenizing this space. A lot of the naming projects on campus are on hold as we're in the process of finalizing the university wide Naming Policy. Aaron provided update on Residence Naming Project. OII to re-circulate Naming Policy DRAFT to Caucus. Having the medicine wheel gathering space in the Jim Leech room – are there concerns from Caucus? J. Hill & C. A. Budd have no issues with the name remain and the artwork installed. A. Doxtator & L. Claus-Johnson confirmed the decision.
