

INCREASE KNOWLEDGE AND SELF-ESTEEM

Both parents and students gain more knowledge about the student's disability and how it affects learning. Students identify areas of strengths and celebrate differences.

BUILD SELF-ADVOCACY SKILLS

Students and parents review the language around IEPs and their rights to accommodations. Students develop self-advocacy skills to express their needs.

BELONGING

STEPS students learn from each other. In a positive, encouraging space, students develop friendships and learn about themselves, their strengths, and their needs.

STEPS is a program for students with neurodevelopmental conditions affecting learning (including learning disabilities and ADHD). The goal: to assist students and families with making a successful transition from elementary school to secondary school and beyond. The program consists of an updated psychoeducational assessment, with student and parent/guardian targeted programming over the course of the program. We host group sessions, Assistive Technology training, and a high school transition camp.

The STEPS program is run by the Regional Assessment and Resource Centre at Queen's University. The program is free except for the psychoeducational assessment which costs \$2000 (flexible payment options available over 2 year period). This may be covered by some supplemental health insurance plans.

COST

The STEPS program is free. However, the psychoeducational assessment has a fee of \$2000. This can be paid over 2 years in installments.

ELIGIBILITY

- Apply in Grade 7 (fall/winter)
- Have impairments in academic achievement and require accommodations at school
- Previously diagnosed with relevant disability or have a history that strongly suggests a relevant disability
- Have average intellectual functioning, based on previous assessment findings

PROGRAM SCHEDULE

STEPS begins in Grade 7 (with the application process) and finishes in the summer before Grade 9 begins. The RARC transition team is comprised of certified teachers, clinical psychologists, and even some Queen's students! Programming determinations are grounded in research and all of our programming prioritizes the student and the development of their self-esteem, self-awareness, and self-advocacy. Many games are incorporated throughout and students have a lot of fun while they learn about themselves!

Grade 7

- Fall 2024/Winter 2025: Students apply to the program
- Upon being accepted, psychoeducational assessments scheduled

Grade 8

- October/November 2025: Weekly evening sessions take place for parents and students, with sessions focusing on learning differences, self-esteem, self-advocacy, and navigating IPRCs and IEPs at the school level
- May 2026: Weekly evening sessions take place for parents and students, with sessions focusing on high school course selection, adolescent development and strengthening relationships with your teen, and self-advocacy and effective communication
- Summer 2026: 1 week of secondary school transition camp for students that includes Assistive Technology training

Please note that transportation is not provided with the STEPS program.
