The School of Religion in conjunction with Jewish Studies at Queen’s University invites applications from suitably qualified candidates interested in teaching an undergraduate course in **Mythology of the Ancient Near East** (RELS 212). This is a remote, upper level lecture course with an expected enrolment of ~95 students.

Candidates should have a Ph.D, and teaching experience at the University level in Religious Studies. This is a Fall term appointment for the period September 1 to December 31, 2021 with classes in session from September 7, 2021 to December 3, 2021.

The University invites applications from all qualified individuals. Queen's is strongly committed to employment equity, diversity, and inclusion in the workplace and encourages applications from Black, racialized/visible minority and Indigenous/Aboriginal people, women, persons with disabilities, and 2SLGBTQ+ persons. All qualified candidates are encouraged to apply; however, Canadians and permanent residents will be given priority.

The University will provide support in its recruitment processes to applicants with disabilities, including accommodation that takes into account an applicant’s accessibility needs.
