GOVERNANCE UPDATES

<u>The Chancellor</u> is the highest officer and the ceremonial head of the University. Modelled after similar positions at Scottish universities, the office was created in 1874 and first filled in 1877, although it was only enshrined in law in 1882 after a convoluted process (see **Royal Charter**).

The Chancellor presides over **convocations**, confers degrees, and chairs the annual meetings of the **University Council**. He or she is an ex-officio voting member of the **Board of Trustees** and many of its committees. The Chancellor is also a member of the University Council Executive Committee and the **Honorary Degrees** Committee of the **Senate**. Joint Board-Senate committees for the selection of a **Principal** are normally chaired by the Chancellor.

The Chancellor is appointed for a renewable three-year term by the University Council.

Email for Life



Keep your Queen's connections alive with a permanent Queen's email address. As alumni, you can sign up for a permanent @queensu.ca email address.

For recent graduates (2013 and beyond) your student email automatically converts to a permanent email address. To keep your email service active, you must log into your account at least once per year. If you are only using your Queen's email account to forward mail to another address, then you will still need to log in to avoid loss of service.

For other alumni, you will need to reactivate your NetID to gain access to Alumni Email for Life. <u>Instructions for reactivating your NETID</u>.

Once your NetID is activated, you can log into your Office 365 email at <u>this link</u>. If you have completed the setup process and have issues with the activation/authentication process, please contact IT Services directly at 613-533-6666 or via their contact page.
