## November 15 - Bader Day



Nov. 15, 1941, a young student arrived on campus for the first time to begin his studies. It was the beginning of a historic relationship that would eventually transform Queen's. That was the day the university's most prominent and generous supporter, **Alfred Bader**, BSc'45, BA'46, Msc'47, LLD'86, arrived. On November 15th, 2021, which marked the 80th anniversary of Alfred Bader's arrival on our campus, the day was declared "**Bader Day**."

The first reunion in 1926 attracted 870 alumni drawn from the classes of 1874 to 1926. Although technically scheduled for the entire week, most of the alumni attended only the weekend events. This included the **football** game that was held on Saturday, November 13 between Queen's and the University of Toronto, which Queen's won 3-1. It was at this first official alumni reunion that the **Alumni Association** was formed, thanks to a unanimous vote by those graduates in attendance. See the Queen's Encyclopedia for more details.
