# **GOVERNANCE UPDATES**

#### **Executive Committee**

The Committee met on February 7 and **Doug Bruce** was re-elected as Committee Vice-Chair. The Committee approved appointments to the 2025 Program Committee and received a report from L. Golubitksy, as a follow-up to the 2024 AGM and in-person Retreat. Dates for the 2025 AGM and in-person events will be circulated to Councillors soon.

**The call for the 2025 Distinguished Service Awards is now open!** Do you know someone who has made Queen's a better place and deserves to be recognized? Inaugurated by the University Council in 1974, this award recognizes individuals who have made Queen's a better place through their outstanding contributions. Each year the University Council Executive Committee invites nominations for up to six DSAs, one of which will be reserved this year to recognize exceptional alumni contributions. #### **Nominating Committee**

**Council Trustee Election Update: Chessa Jope and Jeremy Gooden** are the successful candidates in the recent election to the Board of Trustees. Chessa and Jeremy (re-elected to his second term) will serve three-year terms, beginning June 1, 2025. 93% (43/46) of Councillors voted in this election.

**2025 University Council Election Update:** The 2025 University Council election will be held from May 14-28. The Call for Nominations will be launched on March 19 and will run for two weeks, closing on April 2. There will be ten positions with four-year terms (September 2025-2029) available for alumni in the 2025 election. Councillors are encouraged to share the call for nominations with their alumni networks and encourage nominations.

3. (New) The Distinguished Service Awards (DSA) ceremony will be held on Friday evening followed by a Friday night Council social event.
