The <u>Nobel Prize Inspiration Initiative was hosted at Queen's University</u> on September 25, 2019, featuring a public dialogue on "Failure, persistence and joy: finding the right balance for research success" at the Isabel Bader Centre. The event featured Martin Chalfie (2008 Nobel Laureate in Chemistry), with Arthur McDonald (2015 Nobel Laureate in Physics), and Mona Nemer (Chief Science Advisor of Canada), moderated by André Picard (Health Columnist at *The Globe and Mail*).
